Year 3 Spanish

Spanish

Spanish is taught by a specialist Spanish teacher, Mrs Sadullah, on a Wednesday. In year 3 we focus on 4 skills; listening, speaking, reading and writing. We also build our knowledge of Spanish phonics, vocabulary and grammar. We do this through lots of games, songs, stories, puzzles and creative tasks. We learn how to recognise

letters and sounds in Spanish and use this to help us learn to read and write simple words and phrases. We learn how to ask and answer some simple conversation questions, count more confidently to 20 or more and build our colour vocabulary including how to use these adjectives in sentences. We also learn other vocabulary such as fruit, family members and some animals as well as learning about interesting grammar rules like gender and adjective order.

We also have an eTwinning link with a school in Spain and collaborate on various projects and themes together for example sharing Christmas Cards or taking part in a video conference.

Year 4 Spanish

Spanish

Spanish is taught by a specialist Spanish teacher on Wednesdays. In year 4 we focus on 4 key skills; listening, speaking, reading and writing. We also build our knowledge of Spanish phonics, vocabulary and grammar. We do this through lots of games, songs, stories, puzzles and creative tasks. We reinforce how to recognise letters and

sounds in Spanish and use this to help us learn to read and write simple words and phrases with good pronunciation and spelling. We build confidence in answering simple conversation questions and talking about ourselves. We learn to count to 30 and in tens to 100 and look more carefully at how adjectives change in a sentence. We extend our vocabulary with personal descriptions, animals and adjectives, dates, birthdays and party food as well as deepening our understanding of interesting grammar rules such as gender and adjective order.

We also have an eTwinning link with a school in Spain and collaborate on various projects and themes together for example sharing Christmas Cards or taking part in a video conference.

Spanish is taught by a specialist Spanish teacher on Wednesdays. In year 5 we focus on 4 key skills; listening, speaking, reading and writing. We also build our knowledge of

Spanish phonics, vocabulary and grammar. We do this through lots of games, songs, stories, puzzles and creative tasks. We continue to reinforce Spanish letters and sounds and use this knowledge to help us read and write more complex words and longer sentences. We build our repertoire of questions and answers in conversations and talking about ourselves. We learn numbers to 100 and extend our vocabulary to include verbs, nouns and adjectives that help us describe sports and opinions, planets and their descriptions and clothing. We develop our understanding of Spanish grammar more by focussing on adjective agreement and simple verb conjugations as well as joining sentence with connectives.

We also have an eTwinning link with a school in Spain and collaborate on various projects and themes together for example sharing Christmas Cards or taking part in a video conference.

Year 6 Spanish

Spanish

Spanish is taught by a specialist Spanish teacher on Wednesdays. In year 6 we deepen our understanding of how to listen, speak, read and write in another language and further develop our knowledge of Spanish phonics, vocabulary and grammar. We do this through lots of games, songs, stories, puzzles and creative tasks as well as longer pieces of writing and more complex texts. We use our knowledge of Spanish letters and sounds to help us read and write paragraphs and unfamiliar words. We continue to practice and build our repertoire of questions and answers in conversations and talking about ourselves. We practice numbers to 100 and bigger numbers and extend our vocabulary further to help us describe where we live and what we like to do. We deepen our understanding of Spanish grammar through investigating verbs and their conjugations as well as having the opportunity to use adjective agreement, singular and plural nouns, connectives and a range of verbs in a variety of sentence structures. In preparation for secondary school, we learn different revision techniques and also have an introduction to French.

We also have an eTwinning link with a school in Spain and collaborate on various projects and themes together for example sharing Christmas Cards or taking part in a video conference.

Enrichment

Spanish

In Spanish enrichment, we apply the skills (listening, speaking, reading and writing) and knowledge (phonics, vocabulary and grammar) to creative projects. These projects are tailored to the children's needs, interests and creative curriculum topics.

The projects often develop intercultural understanding of Spain and other Spanish speaking countries. For example, some of enrichment groups have learnt about **South American countries** by exploring maps, art, craft, food and music, or children have learnt about Spanish festivals such as **Dia de los Muertos** or **Las Fallas.**

Other enrichment sessions have included **Spanish drama**, where we performed a mini-play, **Spanish poetry**, where we learnt poems off by heart, represented them through art and then entered a global poetry competition, **dragons**, where we described dragons and learnt a dragon poem, **haunted houses**, where we learnt to describe rooms in the house and made a haunted house, **stop motion animation**, where we created mini movies of aliens and greetings, creating a video about our local area and producing a magazine for people who want to learn Spanish on holiday.

In addition to this, we may also prepare things to share with our **Spanish Partner School in Madrid** at various times throughout the year.
