Childminders can borrow a copy of the WellComm toolkit by visiting your <u>local</u> <u>library</u>. The toolkit can be loaned for 3 weeks and renewed if necessary. The library can also request a toolkit from another library if theirs is already on loan. You can also contact settings in your local partnership to request use of their toolkits.

You can also be part of the 'WellComm Assessment data return'. This helps provide a city wide picture of children's speech, language and communication needs. Assessment data can be returned to us each year between 1st October and 31st January. Please contact etfy@york.gov.uk if you would like more information on returning your data securely to us.

Reminder:

- You will need to screen all early year's children annually in the autumn term and share the headline outcome of the screen for all children (Red, Amber, Green) with the Local Authority via our process.

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NARROWING THE GAP

Speech and Language UK have recently launched their new report <u>Listening to unheard children</u> which reveals a shocking rise in the number of children struggling with talking and understanding words. The research shows that 1.9 million children are struggling with talking and understanding words. That's a huge increase of 26% over the last two years. They have developed an ambitious new strategy to tackle this.
