Dear Families,
We hope you have had a good week and are enjoying more of the spring weather. Thank you for all your generous donations to Comic Relief. The children looked fabulous in their red clothes and accessories.

A huge thank you for your support in ensuring that all children in school are wearing the correct school uniform. This is very much appreciated and the children look very smart. Just a quick reminder that the only items of jewellery that are permitted in school are stud earrings. Due to health and safety considerations, children are not permitted, however, to wear earrings during P.E. activities. Ideally, children should not wear their earrings to school on P.E. days, but if they do, then the earrings should be removed prior to the P.E. lesson. We do understand that children who have recently had their ears pierced may not be able to remove them for 6 weeks. In these circumstances, we will provide the children with tape to place over their earrings for the duration of the lesson.
If your child comes to school with rings or necklaces we will ask them to remove them, as this is inline with our policies and procedures. Thank you for your support with this and following our health and safety policy.

Evidence of absences

Parents/carers can be prosecuted for their child's unauthorised absences. An absence may be unauthorised by the school if evidence is not provided. Please ensure that all available evidence is brought into school. This may include:

- ★ Appointment cards
- ★ Hospital / clinic / appointment letters
- ★ Medicine boxes / bottles showing the prescription label



Why is it important to have up to date phone numbers?

School may need to contact you in a range of situations and it is essential that they have up to date contact numbers. If a pupil is absent from school or fails to arrive at school with no contact from parents/carers then school staff will attempt to contact all emergency contacts to establish the whereabouts and wellbeing of the child.

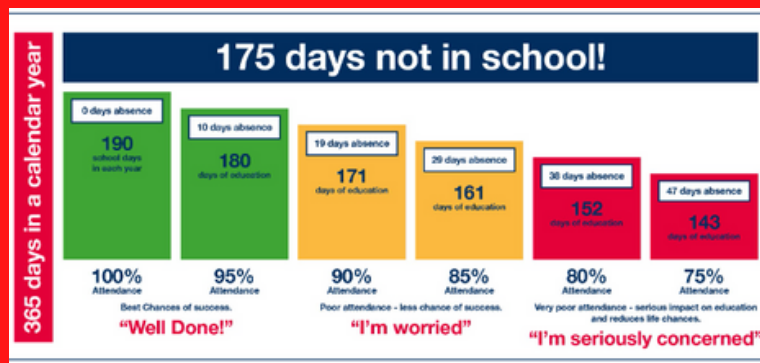
Where school staff have been unable to make contact further action such as home visits, safe and well checks and referrals to other agencies including the police may need to be made.

Remember the 5 SMART rules when using the Internet and mobile phones.



S

SAFE: Keep safe by being careful not to give out personal information – such as your full name, email address, phone number, home address, photos or school name – to people you are chatting with online.



M

MEET: Meeting someone you have only been in touch with online can be dangerous. Only do so with your parents' or carers' permission and even then only when they can be present.



A

ACCEPTING: Accepting emails, IM messages, or opening files, pictures or texts from people you don't know or trust can lead to problems – they may contain viruses or nasty messages!



R

RELIABLE: Information you find on the internet may not be true, or someone online may be lying about who they are. Make sure you check information before you believe it.



T

TELL: Tell your parent, carer or a trusted adult if someone or something makes you feel uncomfortable or worried, or if you or someone you know is being bullied online.



Note to parents: Please check the age ratings/settings for computer games.



ZIP IT

Keep your personal stuff private and think about what you say and do online.



BLOCK IT

Block people who send nasty messages and don't open unknown links and attachments.



FLAG IT

Flag up with someone you trust if anything upsets you or if someone asks to meet you offline.

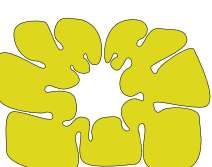

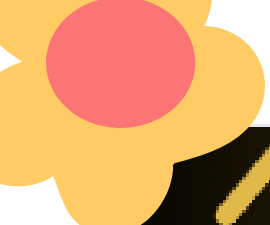
