Music at our school, incorporating the National Curriculum, Model Music Curriculum (MMC) and National Plan for Music

Our Weekly Music Teaching Offer

- EYFS pupils receive a weekly music lesson with our Music Lead based on traditional rhyme and song with lots of opportunities to explore instruments, sing and perform.
- KS1 pupils receive a weekly music lesson with our Music Lead incorporating lots of singing and the use of untuned percussion to compose and perform.
- KS2 pupils receive a weekly music lesson with our Music Lead. Children explore the full range of musical dimensions and have opportunities to play instruments including the recorder in Y3, the ukulele in Y4, string instruments in Y5 and tuned percussion in Y6.
 All classes work on listening performing, composing & singing.
- KS1 Singing Assembly Y1 and Y2 receive a weekly 30 minute singing assembly where the children come together to sing a wide range of songs.
- SEND we aim to make all our musical activities accessible to all.

- <u>Singing Stars</u> Our Y2 Y6 children are invited to join our school choir that runs weekly throughout the year and perform in school concerts.
- Orchestra Our KS2 children are invited to join our school orchestra that runs weekly throughout the year and performs in the Christmas Service and at the Summer Music Concert.
