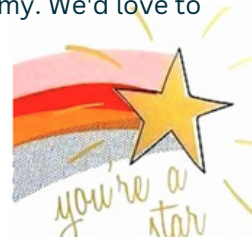
Message from Mrs Robinson to our school community

Safeguarding Tip Of The Week Domestic Abuse

This week's safeguarding focus is on domestic abuse, which is defined as any type of controlling, coercive, threatening behaviour, violence, or abuse between people who are, or have been, in a relationship—regardless of gender or sexuality. It can also occur between family members who are related. It can affect children directly or indirectly—by seeing or hearing abuse, being hurt themselves, or not receiving the care they need due to the impact on their parent or carer. Experiencing domestic abuse in childhood is a form of child abuse. It's important we remain alert to the signs and offer support where needed. Online Safety Tip Of The Week EA Sports FC26

We are sharing a helpful online safety guide for EA FC 26, the latest edition of the popular football game. The guide highlights key concerns, including in-game purchases, which can quickly add up, exposure to scams, and interactions with strangers through voice chat. It also provides practical tips for managing these risks, setting parental controls, and ensuring children can enjoy the game safely while developing positive online habits.

The Monkey App is a video chat and social networking app that randomly matches strangers for a 15 second face to face video call. Once the video chat begins users have 15 seconds to decide what to do next. They can request more time to chat or end the chat and match with another person.

Sexually explicit content on the app is common place. It has been assessed as not safe for children due to lax age verification policies, privacy concerns and persistent issues with harmful and sexual content.

The UK based Safer Schools Safeguarding App released an alert calling "Monkey" extremely dangerous. There is no age verification process in place which means adults can manipulate their profiles to make themselves appear much younger.

It is an app centred around the sharing of personal information and the lowering of privacy barriers. Users cannot use the app without allowing access to their camera or microphone.
